

BUILDING COMMUNITY TOLERANCE BY UNDERSTANDING AIRSPACE PATTERNS

Improve your airport's community relations by increasing knowledge and setting expectations about airspace trends.

The public is becoming increasingly concerned about an airport's impact on their environment. Aircraft have become quieter, yet complaints at many airports are on the rise because annoyance is about more than just noise levels. Provide your community with a clear understanding of airspace patterns to manage perceptions and gain support for sustainable growth.

WebTrak MyNeighbourhood enables community access to airspace trend information in order to increase their knowledge, trust and tolerance. Allowing the public to self serve reduces noise office workloads and frees staff up to address the concerns people raise.

The web-based service improves the public's awareness of how current airport operations are affecting their environment, and to explore how their airspace has changed over time. With this insight, people can more accurately discern the long-term impact of airport operations on their neighbourhood.

The system aligns perceptions with fact-based data and answers questions such as: Are aircraft flying over my home getting lower or louder? Are more aircraft flying over my house

now than a few months ago? If I buy a house in a specific location, how will aircraft noise affect me? Why has aircraft noise woken me up numerous times in the past month and will this continue? How are airport operations distributed around the community?

WebTrak MyNeighbourhood integrates with an airport's noise abatement system so it presents accurate information that's always consistent with other published data. It shows

patterns using simple-to-understand maps illustrating a broad picture of airport operations. Because the system doesn't identify individual aircraft, it can be used where restrictions prohibit sharing single flight tracks.
